General Description of Position

Supervision Received: Will be directly under the Bureau of Indian Affairs of Command (i.e., Bureau of Indian Affairs Chief of Police).

Supervision Exercised: None

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES (Examples may include but are not limited to the following).

The incumbent as a Tribal Police Officer on an Indian Reservation or group of reservations subject to the criminal jurisdiction of the Federal, State, and Local governments, and/or a Tribe involving Indian and/or Indian property, performs the complete range of police duties recognized as requiring fully developed police knowledge and skills. Responds to calls concerning felonies and misdemeanors, such as burglary, robbery, larceny, automobile theft, assault, rape and homicides. Investigates apprehends, arrests, and detains all persons charged with violations of U.S. Title 18, Chapters 1152, 1153, 1164 and 1165, Title 25, Code of Federal Regulations; Tribal Law and Order Codes, Federal, State Law and State Law and Statutes that apply within Indian Country.

Positions are subject to a written test, Physical Efficiency Battery test, pre-employment drug test and a background investigation.

This is a critical sensitive position subject to background investigation.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

Required knowledge, skills, and Abilities

EDUCATION & EXPERIENCE: High School Diploma/GED or two years of successfully completed study at an accredited school above the high school level, which included at least 12 semester hours in police administration, police law and evidence, police investigation, criminology, law enforcement, general law, or similar subjects closely related to police or guard work must have been include in the substituted education. Successful completion of a full four (4) year course of study required B.S. degree IN Police Science or a comparable degree program for an accredited school above the high school level.

NECESSARY REQUIREMENT

Must have a valid Utah State Drivers License and must be able to obtain Tribal license.
Must pass a pre-employment test.
Must have passed a criminal background check.

Physical Fitness Requirements: As a condition of employment, ALL applicants must pass the Physical Efficiency Battery (PEB).

Prior to appointment, applicants MUST undergo a Physical Examination to determine if physically and medically capable of performing the essential duties of the position efficiently and without hazard to themselves or others.

All applicants tentatively selected for this position will be required to submit to urinalysis to screen for illegal drug use prior to appointment.

Persons appointed to Police Officer position must be a least 21 years of age. This requirement may be waived only for veterans.

Will be required to serve a probationary period of one year, which is in agreement with the memorandum of understanding with the Bureau of Indian Affairs and the Tribal Business Committee Members.
