

75th Anniversary Pearl Harbor Remembrance Day

On 7 December 1941, the Japanese surprise attacked Pearl Harbor, Hawaii. President Franklin D. Roosevelt dubbed the attack as "a date which will live in infamy." The attack commenced on a Sunday morning at 7:48 a.m. and would leave 2,402 US Servicemen dead. The following day, the US declared war on Japan, and three days later Germany and Italy declared war on the US. The United States was now enjoined in the Second World War. Many men enlisted in the Armed Forces and approximately 100 Ute Tribal Veterans served during that time. There is one living Ute Tribe World War II Veteran still alive, his name is

Lee J. Alhandra. Lee J. Alhandra was born on 23 September 1923 in Fort Duchesne, Utah. At the time of his induction into the Armed Forces, the US Army, he was 19 years of age. He was drafted on 27 May 1943 and entered Active Duty on 3 June 1943 entering service at Salt Lake City, Utah. His home address at that time was in White Rocks, Utah. He was 5'9" tall and weighed 149 lbs. His civilian occupation was a Farmer.

After his basic military training, he departed with his unit on 17 November 1943 to the European Theatre of Operations (ETO) and arrived in country on 24 November 1943. He was a member of Company F, 28th Infantry Regiment which distinguished itself in combat during World War II as part of the 8th Infantry Division. After landing on Utah Beach on 4 July 1944, its first action was an attack to the south to establish a critical bridgehead over the Ay River so that armored divisions could launch a breakout and then attack into Brittany and Northern France.

During its ten months of combat, the regiment played a major part in four allied campaigns – winning three Presidential Unit Citations embroidered Normandy, Bergstein and Stockheim. It captured over 115,000 prisoners and vast stores of enemy material. Private First Class Lee J. Alhandra participated in four major campaigns. Normandy, Northern France, Rhineland and Central Europe. His unit departed Europe on 29 June 1945 and arrived back in the United States on 6 July 1945. He was separated from the Army on 15 October 1945 at Fort Francis E. Warren, Wyoming.

He was awarded the Combat Infantryman Badge, Good Conduct Medal, European-African-Middle Eastern Campaign Medal (EAME) with four Bronze Service Stars, and the Marksman Rifle Badge. 28th Infantry Regiment Distinctive Unit Insignia "Lions of Cantigny" (special designation). During World War I, they were assigned to the First Expeditionary Division which later became the 1st Infantry Division. They were in France and during the Battle of Cantigny, the 28th attacked the Germans and earned the moniker, "The Black Lions of Cantigny."


Bureau of Indian Affairs officer Adolf Bush was recognized and his niece Laurianne Yazzie accepted his certificate on his behalf.



Officer Adolph F. Bush

Officer Bush was shot to death while investigating a report of domestic violence. The 27-year-old officer was dispatched to a home in Randlett. Upon arrival, a female victim told Officer Bush that her husband had struck her during an argument. When Officer Bush located the suspect in a bedroom, the suspect shot him with a .30-30 rifle. After Officer Bush fell, the suspect shot him again. The suspect then used the radio in the police vehicle to announce the crime. He was still talking on the radio when arrested by responding officers. The suspect was charged in federal court, but U.S. Judge Willis Ritter systematically undermined the prosecution's case until it was forced to dismiss all charges. Officer Bush was married and the father of two small children. He is buried in John Harmes Cemetery, in Whiterocks.

His bronze memorial plaque is sponsored by the Ute Indian Tribe.

Is going to be held on December 21, 2016. Parents and Guardians please contact your advocate or stop by the Main Office to update your emergency contact information. The Ute Indian Tribe Head Start WILL NOT accept any over the phone release authorizations of a child to anyone who is not on the emergency contact. Please have your phones on standby when the Ute Indian Tribe Head Start staff calls. Parents/Guardians must pick up their child within 1 hour and 45 minutes of the time you have been notified to pick up your child. If your child is not picked up within this time, and/or once the Staff has depleted all contact numbers without successful contact, the child will be transported to Division of Children and Family Services (DCFS) or the Ute Indian Tribe Social Services. Let's all make this a successful Emergency Evacuation!

Refilia "Rafella" V. Curry Smith, age 88, of Salt Lake City, entered the spirit world on Friday, December 2, 2016. She succumbed to the effects of cancer at the Huntsman Cancer Center in Salt Lake City with her family by her side.

She was born January 2, 1928, to Harry and Lorena Wiltzie Smith on the Pyramid Lake Paiute Reservation in Nevada. She is a tribal member. She often spoke of her grandpa, Johnny. She also spent many years in Loyaltan, CA, with her mother's Washoe people.

Refilia attended High School at the Sherman Institute in Riverside, CA, graduating in 1946. While there, she met and then married Richard Curry, Sr. They later divorced.

After raising most of her children on the Uintah and Ouray Reservation, she moved to the Salt Lake area to find employment and raise the rest of her children. One of the highlights of her career was meeting and knowing the billionaire, James LaVoy Sorenson, who employed her as a seamstress at LaVoy's and then at Sorenson Research and Medical Supplies. While in the Salt Lake Val-

ley, she met and married her companion of many years, Pedro F. Velasquez. They were later divorced.

Upon retirement, she spent a lot of time interacting with others at the SL American Indian Center. She was very involved with her elders group that met and enjoyed various activities for the elders. She had many friends in this group and enjoyed and appreciated them all. Her two special sidekicks were Rose and Fern. Refilia is survived by her children, Richard Curry Jr (Simone Wilson), Roosevelt, Ralph Curry, Crow Heart, Wyoming; Royce (Margaret) Curry, Independence; Rayma Curry, Rudy Curry, both of Salt Lake City; step-children, Rory, Ryan & Ronnie Curry, all of Roosevelt; Reggie (Victoria) Curry, Arizona; Kenneth Frost, Ignacio, CO. 24 grandchildren, 53 great-grandchildren, 5 great-great-grandchildren; and a sister, Carmelita Evans DeLucci, Nevada.

She was preceded in death by her parents, sisters, Hazel McMasters, Ramona Mitchell; brothers, Lester Wilson, Wilbur Smith, Manuel Smith, a daughter, Regina Curry Livingston; 3 grandsons, Shawn Francisco, Thomas Curry, Redstone Curry, and Craig Bumgarner; step-son, Gene Velasquez; two infant brothers, Walter & Jake Evans, II.


