


Business Committee and Tribal Members Deliever 170,000 Signatures Opposed to The Utah Public Land Ini- tiative Indian Land Grab to Congress.



Business Committee and Tribal Members Present Petition to Senator Hatch's Office

Last week, the Business Committee and three Tribal Members delivered a petition with about 170,000 signatures to United States House of Representatives Speaker Paul Ryan and the Utah Congressional Delegation. The petition was opposed to H.R. 5780, the Utah Public Lands Initiative and its proposal to take more than 100,000 acres of Reservation lands for the State of Utah. The bill would also limit the Tribe's sovereignty, jurisdiction and water rights over another 300,000 acres of lands within the Reservation.

In just a few weeks through the efforts of UtePAC, Sharlisa Mountainlion, Kathrian Standingrock, Trini Wopsock and others collected thousands of signatures opposed to the bill. A press conference highlighting petition and its opposition to H.R. 5780 was held on the steps of Capitol Hill.

The Business Committee also continued to meet with Congressional Offices to ensure strong opposition to H.R. 5780. H.R. 5780 has been passed out of the House Natural Resources Committee but must come before the House Rules Committee before it can be considered for debate and a vote by the full House of Representatives. Congressional Offices reported that there was little time to consider the bill during the current lame duck Congress and if the bill is not passed this year the bill would need to start over in the next Congress.

While in Washington, D.C. the Business Committee also met with the White House to continue to push for trust restoration of lands within the Tribe's Uncompahgre Reservation, and met with the Environmental Protection Agency seeking tribal consultation on a proposed rule for permitting of air emissions for oil and gas operations.

A stack test, also referred to in EPA regulations as a performance or source test, measures the amount of a specific regulated pollutant, pollutants, or surrogates being emitted; demonstrates the capture efficiency of a capture system; or determines the destruction or removal efficiency of a control device used to reduce emissions at facilities subject to the requirements of the Clean Air Act (CAA or Act). Stack testing is an important tool used to determine a facility's compliance with emission limits, or capture or control efficiencies established pursuant to the CAA (Clean Air Act).

All prospective bidders will be required to have an approved UTERO License in order to execute work on Ute land. If you are an Ute owned business or an UTERO licensed vendor and perform stack testing services as described above, then please contact Greg Kay at Gregory.k.kay@tsocorp.com by no later than December 1, 2016 in order to be considered for participation and award.

LETTER TO THE EDITOR:

Wednesday, November 9, 2016 I attended a "Kill the Bill" (Rob Bishop's Public Lands Initiative, (PLI) in Fort Duchesne. After attending this rally, a thought occurred to me: How can we, as a nation, honor treaties with some foreign sovereign nations, and not honor treaties with the sovereign nations of the American Indians?
Almost all treaties with the various American Indian peoples have been violated or discarded for enrichment of the mineral extraction industries or homesteading.
The Ute Nation of Utah is facing the same fate as the Lakota Sioux, In 1875 the Lakota lost the Black Hills to mineral extraction (gold), They were given the Black Hills and the

southeast part of Montana, northeastern part of "Wyoming and large tracts of land in North Dakota and South Dakota for "as long as the grass grows..." In the late 1860's. A decade later, gold was discovered in the Blacks Hills. The Treaty was broken. They were forced off of their lands. There was no compensation given to them.
Om 2016. Congressman Rob Bishop, through his PLI, want to change the Ute Reservation Boundary. The reason: mineral extraction. He wants to "steal" approximately 100, 000 acres for the extraction of oil shale, tar sands, and oil and gas. He wants the revenue now going to the Utes to go to the state. The lands would fail under the administration of SITLA (School and Institutional Trust Lands Administration). There would be no compensation to the Utes.

It is unfortunate the Congressman Bishop was history teacher as the either did not learn from the lessons taught from history or perhaps he taught foreign history and, therefore, was unaware of the mistreatment of the mistreatment of America's indigenous peoples.
It is no longer about the "sins our forefathers" committed against the American Indian. It is up to us to not repeat these "sins." It is our grave travesties against the American Indian that we should be concerned about. It is up to us to honor our words to these sovereign nations. It is up to us to recognize and honor their status as Sovereign Nations. It is up to us to stop the greed of mineral extraction in areas that are sacred to them. It is also up to us to protest everyone's air and water. It is up to us to stop Congressman Rob

Bishop's Public Land Initiative, to stop the Dakota Access Pipeline, and to make the Bear's Ears area, a place that is sacred to the American Indian peoples, a National Monument.
It is time to support our own Sovereign Nations, our American Indian brothers and sisters. Please write you elected officials in Congress and the Senate to stop Bishop's land grab, the Dakota Access Pipeline, and to support the Bears Ears National Monument.

She served as president of the Red Rock Corporation and 9 years as the Minority Representative on the FSA board.

She was an active member of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, serving many years as a Primary Teacher. She loved the kids in her classes and always had a birthday party for each kid at McDonalds, and a new set of crayons for every new class. She enjoyed hunting, fishing, genealogy, doing yard work, and coaching city league girls' softball. She had a passion for shopping, especially for shoes, and would often use her

excellent price comparison skills to help the grandkids get the most school clothes for their money. She purchased all of the granddaughters' prom dresses. Appearance was paramount and her hair and nails were always perfect. She loved taking her girl trips to Wendover, where she hit the 10,000.00 jackpot a couple of times.

Deedle adored her family, especially her grandchildren – they were her life. She also helped raise many foster-kids and nieces and nephews. She touched many people's lives and will be greatly missed.


