**Friendly Reminder:** If you or anyone in your household have been exposed to someone who has tested positive for COVID-19, you need to self-isolate for at least 14 days from exposure before getting tested for COVID-19.

**When to get tested:** If you start to feel any of these symptoms, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, cough, fever or chills, sore throat, new loss of taste or smell, muscle or body aches, stomach cramps, nausea or vomiting, diarrhea, fatigue, headache, congestion or runny nose.

**What to do if you test positive:** Stay Home, Quarantine for 10 days and mark on the calendar the day you started to show signs, symptoms, and day you tested positive. Keep a daily log of your temperature, symptoms, and overall health.

**When to seek medical attention:** When you experience trouble breathing, persistent pain or pressure in the chest, new confusion, inability to wake or stay awake, bluish lips or face. If you experience any of these symptoms seek immediate medical attention.

**Vaccination:** COVID-19 Vaccinations (Pfizer) will be available at Indian Health Services, call and schedule an appointment at (435) 725-6815.

CDC Regulations require individuals who have not received the COVID-19 vaccinations to wear your masks in public at all times to avoid exposure and to protect the public. If you have yet to be vaccinated please make an appointment at the earliest convenience, and let's work on moving forward.

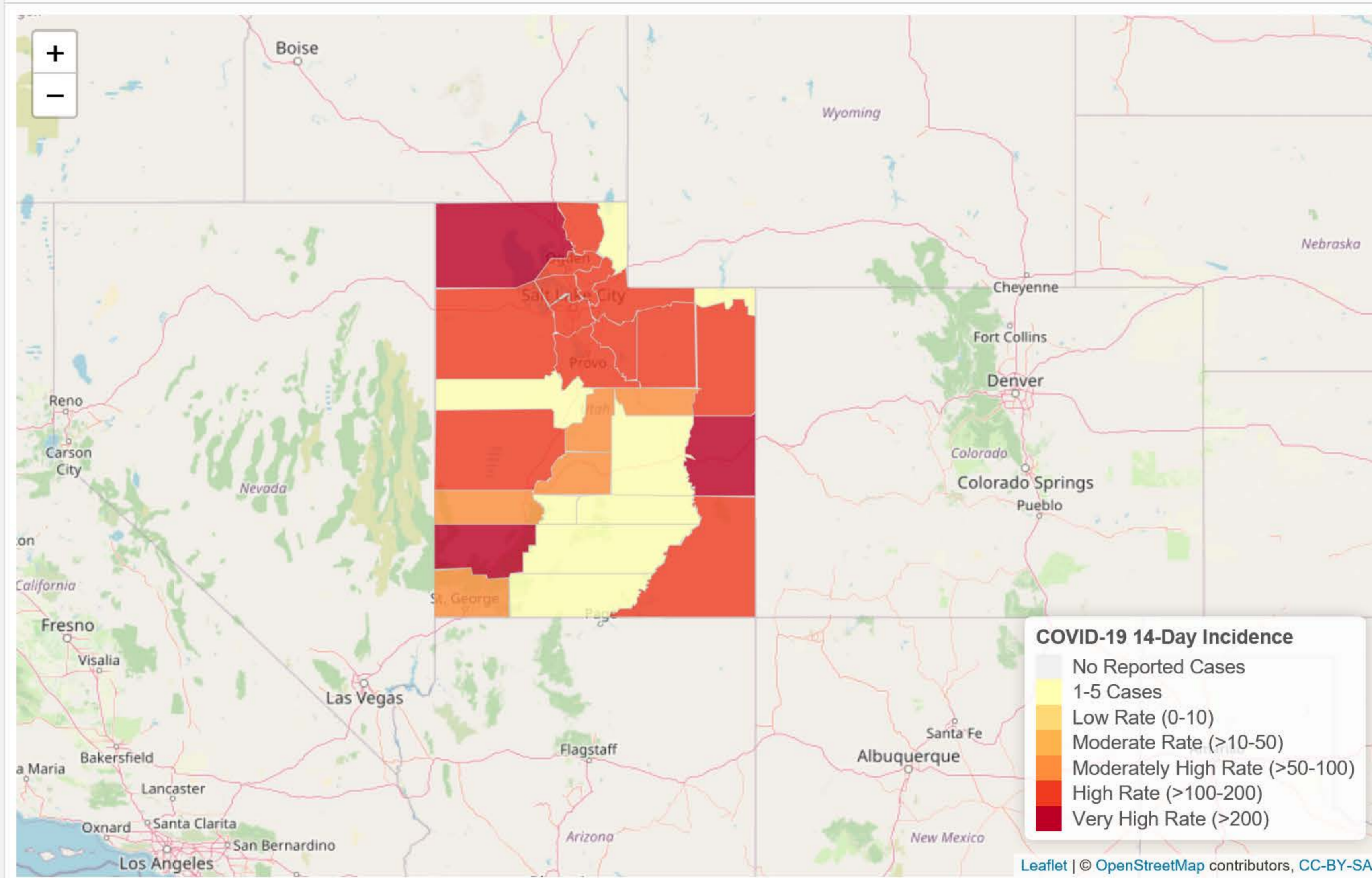
